RAINY DAY ACTIVITIES

Even though St Augustine Beach is an outdoors kind of place, there is still plenty to do indoors!

St Augustine is full of museums and art galleries. Check out these three museums, located very close to each other just north of the Plaza de la Constitucion: The Spanish Military Hospital Museum, the Ximenez-Fatio House, and the Father O'Reilly House, all located on Aviles Street, with easy parking in the area.

Art galleries are dotted up and down Aviles Street, so you can stop in to those as you work your way down the brick road.

Stop in to the Lightner Museum for a real treat. The collections here are primarily from the Gilded Age, and located in the former Alcazar Hotel, built by Henry Flagler in 1888.

About a block from the Lightner is Villa Zorayda, a scaled replica of the Alhambra Palace in Spain.

Flagler College also offers tours and it's right across the street from the Lightner. The college is the former Ponce de Leon Hotel, also built by Henry Flagler. One of the highlights of the tour is the student dining room with the 79 Tiffany stained glass windows. The buildings are a classic example of Spanish Renaissance architecture, built in 1888.

Feeling energetic? Stop by the St Augustine Lighthouse and climb the 219 stairs to the top for a spectacular view of the beaches and the Ancient City.

There's a movie theatre on State Road 207, but you can also see movies at the IMAX Theater at World Golf Village. There you'll find the World Golf Hall of Fame and Museum, which is about 40 minutes from St Augustine Beach.

There's also the Corazon Cinema and Café at 36 Granada Street, next to the Lightner Museum. They show movies and serve a great lunch! Check out their website for some free activities too!

St Augustine is home to two outlet malls at I-95 and State Road 16, about 25 minutes from St Augustine Beach.

Like antiques? Take your umbrella on a stroll through Uptown, on San Marco Avenue just north of downtown and the parking garage. You'll find some great antique stores, art galleries, and a few restaurants.

Off St George Street near the fort, you'll find the famous Potter's Wax Museum. Feed your knowledge of St Augustine and history by taking a trip through the house of wax.
